ANGER!!!

Anger is a difficult feeling. It makes us want to destroy things and say hurtful things we are likely to regret later. When we look back at what we did and said we feel sorry and wish we could have done things differently. So, what can you do to help your child when they feel anger and this anger then becomes difficult to handle for them and you? I have three children who are now teenagers so thankfully issues with anger are few and far between, but I remember when each of my children struggled with anger, and I struggled with what to do when they were angry. Here is a few tips and pointers that might just help:

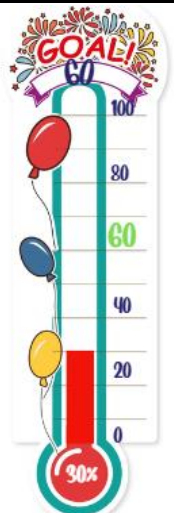
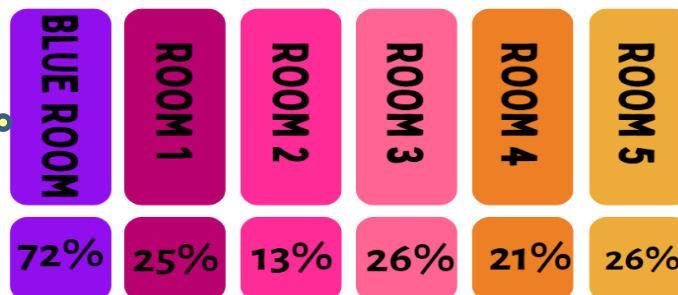
1. Talk to you child about all the emotions like happiness, sadness, excitement, and anger and let them know being angry isn't wrong, it is how we behave when we are angry that can lead them to getting into trouble. Explain that they are allowed to show anger, but they must learn how to deal with their anger in a positive way. (Have this conversation when your child is not angry at the time!!)
2. Get you and your child to recognise the situations in which they become angry, is it when you are rushing out the door in the morning to go to school and you end up raising your voice to get them to hurry up and they then feel under pressure and become angry. Find the situations that make them angry and see how you can work around these circumstances like getting up a little bit earlier, so you don't have to rush as much.
3. Talk to your child about how anger feels especially right at the start, what is the first thing they recognise physically in their body, this may be clenched fists, clenched teeth, breathing heavily. Chat to your child and get them to understand the first signs so they can then begin to recognise for themselves when they are first becoming angry. This way they can recognise it and then begin to find ways to calm themselves down.
4. Find ways that your child can calm themselves down, this may be something as simple as telling you they are angry and needing a hug, to having something like a cuddly toy or pillow to hug or punch. If anger is a frequent occurrence consider having a calm down corner where your child can take themselves and there are some different items there to help them clam down e.g., squishy ball, cuddly toys, weighted blanket, a favourite book, or some calming pictures on the wall.

All children experience anger, and it is a very normal emotion however if you are struggling with the behaviour that goes along with the anger consider trying the tips above and it much just help!
