BUZ stands for Build Up Zone and focuses on developing personal and social skills in students, especially skills to understand, recognise and handle feelings, making and keeping friends, solving fights and handling things when others are not friendly. The program encourages in each student positive self-image, friendship making skills, saying sorry, bully-proofing and lots more! We use role play, stories, activities, and games during the lesson. We have had some great stories in our first few lessons and have learnt that each of us are unique and special, we have learnt about making friends and how to be a good friend, we have also learnt about our feelings of happiness and sadness. 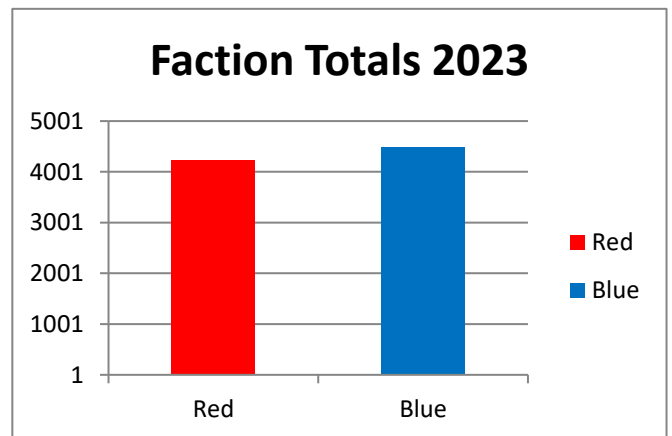

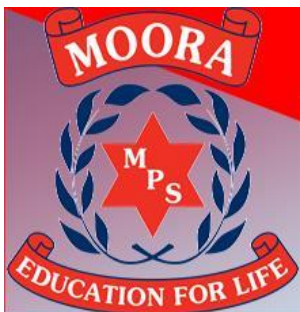

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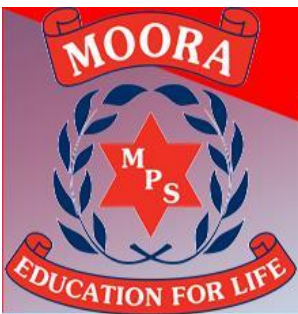
